Work as Good Service

A Framework for work professional and non-professional

Four Core Principles

- Good
- Integrity
- Service
- Humility and Respect

Good

- The results of my work are good. They conduce to human flourishing, environmental health, etc. My job is not destructive.
 - Qualification: There may be a space in between where my product is neither good nor evil. I am not in the moral wrong for doing such work but neither does it count as good service.

Integrity

- I see the results of my work as good. I don't see the results of my work as an evil. In considering what others (clients, customers, bosses) ask me to do, I do not violate my own sense of right and wrong. I seek not only to avoid gross wrongs but to do what is clearly best. I do not promote doing foolish things.
 - Qualification: I may know that my work is used for evil by some people, but the evil is a misuse of something good, not the normal use.
 - Qualification: There may be a space in between where my product is neither good nor evil. I am not in the moral wrong for doing such work, but neither does it count as good service.
 - Implication: I don't participate in doing evil through my work.
 - Implication: I have some understanding of the goods that my work should conduce to.

Service

- My work is not just for myself. I play a role in a community or society. My work, and my work arrangement, is a benefit to others as a matter of principle. It is also subordinate to what they want and need.
 - Note: this plays out in free market competition among other places.
 - Note: this rules out "taking advantage" of people through lies, trickery, etc.

Humility and Respect

- I respect others judgment and decisions and often yield to them.
 - Implication: I am careful to listen to clients, customers, bosses, etc. and not take it for granted that I know best.
 - Implication: I can sometimes be comfortable doing something I think is stupid because it is what others have chosen.
